What is Bicycology?

Bicycology is a cycle activism collective offering activities and resources that promote cycling whilst simultaneously making links with wider environmental and social issues.

Bicycology formed out of the 'G8 Bike-ride' in summer 2005 (see http://g8bikeride.blogspot.com). People came together on this mass ride up the country to demonstrate alternatives to greed and global destruction, and to protest against the G8 meeting in Scotland. The experience was exhilarating and profound, and it inspired the birth of Bicycology. As a non-hierarchical group, each of us shapes the form and direction of our projects, with decisions made by consensus. Through education and entertainment we promote cycling as an empowering alternative to car-dependence and as a symbol of the more environmentally and socially responsible society we wish for. We have no paid staff and we have minimal costs; what we do need comes from

donations and occasional grants.



What does Bicycology do?

We run events which aim to promote cycling in an inspiring, fun and interactive way, and to get people thinking about topics such as environmental destruction and climate change, consumerism and capitalism, and the way our society is organised and run. We hope to encourage people to get involved in learning more about these issues and to empower them to take action themselves.

An event might be a one-off day, as part of a community festival, or it may be part of a larger long-distance 'Roadshow' bike-ride, where the group travels from town-to-town, carrying all equipment entirely by bikes and bike-trailers demonstrating the practicality of the bike.

A Bicycology event includes some or all of the following:

- Dr Bike cycle servicing
- Bike art and decoration workshops
- Pedal-powered games and music
- DI and open mic sessions using "Pedals" our tandem-towed 12 volt sound-system
- Film screenings and discussions
- Displays, literature, and workshops on cycling, transport, food, climate change, renewable energy and similar topics
- Bike games
- Demonstrations of tall bikes and other unusual cycles

We also develop and run other activities on request, such as workshops on building 12 volt sound-systems and pedal-generators, bicycle repair and maintenance, and cycle-training. Many of us are National Standard accredited cycle instructors.
